1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2 This Act may be cited as the “Guaranteeing Resilient
3 Installations for Defense Act of 2024” or the “GRID Act
4 of 2024”.

5 **SEC. 2. DEFENSE CRITICAL ENERGY INFRASTRUCTURE SE-**
6 **CURITY.**

7 Section 215A of the Federal Power Act (16 U.S.C.
8 824o-1) is amended—

9 (1) in subsection (a)—

10 (A) in paragraph (4), by striking “of the
11 48 contiguous States or the District of Colum-
12 bia” and inserting “State”;

13 (B) by redesignating paragraph (8) as
14 paragraph (9); and

15 (C) by inserting after paragraph (7) the
16 following:

17 “(8) RESILIENCE.—The term ‘resilience’ has
18 the meaning given the term in section 1304A(j) of
19 the Energy Independence and Security Act of 2007
20 (42 U.S.C. 17384a(j)).”;

21 (2) in subsection (c), in the matter preceding
22 paragraph (1), by striking “the 48 contiguous States
23 and the District of Columbia” and inserting “any
24 State”; and

25 (3) by adding at the end the following:

1 “(g) AUTHORITY TO ADDRESS VULNERABILITIES.—

2 The Secretary may, to the extent that funds are made

3 available for such purposes in advance in appropriations

4 Acts, enter into contracts or cooperative agreements with

5 external providers of energy—

6 “(1) to improve the security and resilience of

7 defense critical electric infrastructure; and

8 “(2) to reduce the vulnerability of critical de-

9 fense facilities designated under subsection (c) to the

10 disruption of the supply of energy to those facili-

11 ties.”.
